## Advising Plan for the Communication Major Department of Communication and Philosophy

Each semester, faculty in the Department of Communication and Philosophy at Keene State College hold a large group advising meeting. Current majors and minors as well as intended majors and minors are required to attend. The advising meeting is an additional opportunity for students to receive advice about course selection prior to registration each semester. Students are also provided with information about internships, graduate school, and careers for students studying communication.

Faculty members also hold regular office hours each week and welcome students to stop by or make an appointment to ask questions and talk about their program of study and career interests. The offices for faculty in the Department of Communication and Philosophy are located in the Media Arts Center or in Parker Hall.

To be admitted to the Communication major, students must have completed IHCOMM 171: Public Speaking and COMM 175: Introduction to Communication Studies with an average of C or higher in those two courses. If the grade requirements are met, an advisor in the Department of Communication and Philosophy will sign the Declaration of Major form that formally admits the student to the major. Students will select either the Communication or the Philosophy Option within the major. Students may choose an advisor from among the faculty in the Department of Communication and Philosophy, or ask the department chair to assign an advisor. The application for formal admission to the Communication major typically occurs by the end of the second year. Declared students must contact their advisors before registration each semester.
